

[Come let us love the Lord](#)

...that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, that you, being rooted and grounded in love may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge that you may be filled with all the fullness of God. Ephesians 3, 17-19.

The main theme I wanted to meditate on today is to see on what foundation is our faith on Jesus anchored on? Why do we follow Jesus? Is it because all our material needs be fulfilled? Is that a matter of privilege to be found in a hep church? Let us really turn into our hearts and ask ourselves why do I follow Jesus? How important is Jesus in my life? When I set my priorities where is Jesus? It is Jesus Himself who interrupted our sinful lives and chose us to be His own children. He cleansed our dirt, paid the price for our sins and has become the Hope of Glory in our lives. Our salvation is the most spectacular miracle in this world. For this assures us eternal life. And not only that God calls us into a very intimate relationship with Him. Intimacy is always rooted and grounded in love. Any relationship without love will easily wither away. We see this in the parable of the vine and the branches. Without the vine the branches will wither. The same way if Jesus is only the banker or broker or job searcher of our life then when that task is accomplished the relationship with Him will become dry and will slowly die away.

Let us take a day off and see how much do I love Jesus. How far have I gone away from that first love. Do I always realize that Christ is dwelling in my heart? If yes, then is everything in my heart pleasing and acceptable to Him? Just go away and spend a day with Jesus alone. Catch up on all that has been lost along the way. Let me tell you without Jesus life is simply not worth living. There is no meaning. Not only should we rejoice in Him, but take Him to others. Is your life stunted or streams of living waters flowing out of you? Ask God to revive the love that was rushing in your life like mighty roaring falls. It is the Spirit of God who sheds abroad the love of God in our hearts (Romans 5, 5). Come let us seek after the bridegroom. His perfume still lingers on the handles of the lock. Don't give excuses that you are settled for the day. When you hear the knock rise up and open,

Lo, He knocks, His head is covered with dew and His locks with drops of the night... (S of Songs5, 2) he hastens us; there is much sheep who are still not inside the flock. Come let us search. Come let us be away with our Chief Shepherd... Come let us go searching with our Bridegroom... Come, come. Let us follow Jesus...

Dear Spirit of God, fill our hearts with the love of Jesus, that we may get away with the Chief Shepherd loving the lost world and bringing home the prodigal. Amen.
